Each name matters!

The reading of the names of the victims on Yom HaShoah has a special meaning in the Jewish culture. It is a statement against the attempt of Nazi Germany to rob the Jewish people of their identity and to regard them as mere numbers. **The reading of the names of the victims acknowledges every individual** as a valuable person with a distinct name and a unique identity which one consciously remembers.

Yad Vashem, the World Holocaust Remembrance Center in Jerusalem, **has been collecting names and biographical data about all victims of the Shoah** on Pages of Testimonies since its founding. To date the Central Database of Shoah Victims' Names includes 4.8 million names – there remains some 1.5 million unidentified victims.

The cost of collecting, processing and archiving each name is approximately €10. **Your donation supports Yad Vashem's important work and helps ensure that each and every victim will always be remembered!**

The reading of the names is a cooperation between the March of Life e.V. and Yad Vashem in commemoration of Yom HaShoah during the event: "Together for a Better Future without Antisemitism and Hatred of Jews."
